INFORMATION:

1. From a review of this file and from personal knowledge, the following information is submitted:

(a) Organizational Affiliation: The Canadian National Socialist Party (C.N.S.P.) is not associated with any other organization in Canada. They are however a member of the World Union of National Socialists (W.U.N.S.) and they affiliate with the National Socialist White People's Party (N.S.W.P.P.) in the U.S.A.

(b) Sphere of Activity: The C.N.S.P. have held several public meetings in a rented hall during 1969. All meetings were poorly attended by supporters of the Party. John BEATTIE has also made speeches and carried placards through a public park in Toronto and these incidents were also poorly attended by Party supporters. There has been periodic counter demonstrations at demonstrations which were left-wing orientated.

(c) Identity and details of the official publication: The C.N.S.P. has no official publication in Canada. They rely upon other publications, i.e. TRUD Common Sense White Power and the W.U.N.S. Bulletin. All these publications originate in the U.S.A. but are distributed in Canada by the C.N.S.P.

(d) Printing Facilities: The C.N.S.P. have no printing facilities owned by the Party or any members. BEATTIE has been able to periodically use a Gestetner machine owned by

(f) Membership Total: supporters of the Party. It is also believed that the majority of the monies donated is spent by BEATTIE for personal use. It is also believed that no financial support is given to the C.N.S.P. by the N.S.W.P.P.

At the present time, there is no membership in the C.N.S.P. However, it is estimated that BEATTIE has about 50 followers in the "O" Division area.

(g) Identity of each member of current executive and details where adverse influence is exerted by such persons.

National Leader - John BEATTIE /

Comment:

It is not believed that any of the above could exert adverse influence on any person other than some supporters of the Party and this would only be to a degree. It is also pointed out that BEATTIE and do not get along as was further intimated when BEATTIE was supposedly instrumental in having turned away from the World Congress of National Socialists Convention held in Fairfax (near Arlington) Va. earlier this year.

(h) Identification of subversive rank and file members and details where they exert adverse influence.

It is believed that supporters of the C.N.S.P. are only able to exert influence amongst other supporters and possibly some of their/friends. Earlier this year,

(i) Adverse influence which organizations in turn may bring to bear on the community, government, etc.

During past years, John BEATTIE has been able to bring some pressure on the local Civic Government, causing them to pass a by-law restricting speeches in a public park. On occasion, BEATTIE has caused riots in Allan Gardens in Toronto by making public speeches. It is also

believed that because of the existence of the C.M.S.P., some pressure has been brought to bear on Federal authorities in the anti-hate literature bill. It is also pointed out that there has been some association with the Edmund Burke Society (E.B.S.) who in turn may also have aided in the reason for the inception of the hate bill. Recently, some influence was brought to bear on the Bell Telephone Company regarding anti-Jewish messages on the C.N.S.P. telephone code-a-message. This resulted in being convicted under the Telephone Act. As noted, although the following is small, some influence can be brought to bear on the community by the C.N.S.P. It is well known that several people in this country have suffered in the past as a result of the former Nazi Party in Germany and it takes little activity by the C.N.S.P. to get these people alarmed. It is also known that as a result of activities of the C.N.S.P., some influence is brought on local and Federal authorities mostly by the Jewish community in Canada.

INVESTIGATOR'S COMMENTS:

2. The above information is submitted further to the memorandum of the D.S.I. dated 8-12-69 on this file.
3. As noted above, the C.N.S.P. has no organizational affiliation in Canada and the sphere of activity is limited. The party has no finances and because of this there is no printing facilities or official publication. It is not believed that BEATTIE or any other supporter of the party could exert any influence on the Government or the community. The number of supporters is very small and the executive, with the exception of who was appointed by BEATTIE, is self-appointed. It is further pointed out that BEATTIE is a poor leader and organizer who has continual financial worries both from a political and domestic point of view. He gets little help from the majority of the supporters in the operation of the C.N.S.P. as most of them are dull and not politically astute.

In view of the contents of report dated 18-12-69, we are assessing the CNSP as a neo-nazi political group whose influence does not extend beyond its own adherents who number less than 50. It is not a viable political party and for the most part its adherents consist of a very few anti-semitic social dissidents.

2. As the CNSP is not considered a significant threat and one annual report as outlined in "1" Directorate Policy Instructions, COR., paragraph 21(a) to (d) should suffice under normal circumstances. Any travel by BRATFIE or "aides" outside of Canada should be reported immediately, however.

3. With reference to paragraph 11 of report dated 20-11-69, the view is held here that as the publications named contain so little information of Canadian intelligence interest not already on our files, they are not worth receiving.
